Investment in Musselburgh – December 24

Welcome to our newsletter updating you on Scottish Waters work at Esk Wastewater Pumping Station (WwPS).

Programme & Progress Update – Esk WwPS requires a full refurbishment after it experienced pump failure. We have installed temporary pumps which achieves the same operational capability the station requires to maintain essential services.

Our surveys of the building and ancillary equipment have identified complex and extensive work is required to restore the asset and infrastructure. The outstanding construction programme and equipment replacement forecasts a presence onsite until **December 25**.

Next steps – the site perimeter needs to be extended to accommodate deep excavations onto the sewer coming into the station.

This will be completed in the new year and as part of this work, the temporary footpath will be upgraded. The work we are carrying out will allow us to isolate the sewer flows into the station, move the temporary pumps, and begin our programme to replace the existing pumps within the station wet wells.

While our work is ongoing, **there will be no impact to residents' water or wastewater services**. You can keep track of progress via our webpage, and we will provide another newsletter in **Spring 25**.

Festive Period and New Year – Site will close on **Friday 20th December, until Monday 6th January**.

The site has been cleared of plant and equipment. Over the festive period it will be left safe and secure with surveillance monitoring the compound.

We would like to thank the community for your continued cooperation and understanding while this essential work is ongoing.
